



HOLY BAPTISM

Baptism can be performed with sprinkling or immersion. An individual may only receive the sacrament of baptism once in their lifetime. We may break the covenant made in baptism, but God never will. God's love is faithful and steadfast in every season.

We believe all baptisms should occur within the community of faith, which pledges to support the baptized person. Infants cannot answer for themselves, but we believe parents should have their children baptized. When children reach an age of accountability, they can respond to their baptism with faith as part of Confirmation.

Baptizing infants has roots in Scripture as whole households were baptized together, and Jesus made special appeals to include children in the Kingdom of God. Infant baptism reflects the helplessness of all people. God acts in the sacrament of baptism, so it does not matter if the person fully understands. In reality, even the most knowledgeable and brilliant person cannot fathom the wondrous grace imparted at baptism.
